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| 103 | <p>To receive apologies for absence</p> <p>Apologies were received from Penny Lynch, Mark Lynch, Margaret Martin and Jim Whitfield.</p> | |
| 103 | <p>To receive an update on the Floral Corridor from Mr Graham Tait, Flemingate Manager</p> <p>Linda Freeman welcomed Graham Tait to the meeting. She said that the intention is to try to create a floral corridor from Wednesday Market to Flemingate.</p> <p>Graham Tait said that Flemingate achieved Gold last year and in order not to stagnate, more hanging baskets have been purchased to enhance the current hanging baskets. Additional planting is taking place. Flemingate are very keen to ensure they work with the existing groups within the town as we are part of the same town.</p> <p>Clive Waddington said the group are happy to continue the work on Railway Square and work with Flemingate.</p> <p>It was agreed that Graham Tait would speak to Plantscape and Plant Raisers to find out what they could do to create a floral corridor from Wednesday Market to Flemingate. Following these conversation, Clive Waddington, Linda Freeman and Mary Hutchinson would meet with Graham Tait to support and work together to create a plan.</p> <p>Linda Freeman thanked Graham Tait for attending.</p> <p>Globe Mews</p> <p>Mrs Norris spoke of behalf of Globe Mews. She said that Globe Mews is all brick and they would like to enhance the area in which they live and also enter the Town Competition.</p> <p>She was informed that containers can be purchased through Amberol and local garden centres sell brackets.</p> <p>Mrs Norris suggested that a planter be put between the two pollards near the Dog and Duck. Mrs Norris was advised to speak to Iain Sugden from East Riding of Yorkshire.</p> <p>She asked what the colour scheme was for 2017/18 which is gold blue and white for the East Riding of Yorkshire Council. Beverley in Bloom are mindful of the colour scheme when planting but have to take into account the building it is near.</p> | |

| 106 | <p>To receive the Statement of Accounts</p> <p>The Deputy Town Clerk reported there is £913.62 in the account with £51.16 to be refunded from VAT. The Town Council has held its precept in the sum of £2000 towards the work of Beverley in Bloom.</p> | |
| 107 | <p>To receive a verbal Coordinator's report</p> <p>Linda Freeman said that the quality of the plants this year has been exceptional and a letter of thanks is to be prepared to Earleys.</p> <p>Mr Denham of Plant Raisers has agreed to supply the plants for the summer period together with compost with gel/fertiliser. The quantity of compost needs to be known. Linda Freeman agreed to calculate the amount of compost in her barrels. All the liners are to be re-composted.</p> <p>Clive Waddington said he thought the slow release fertiliser has really helped and we have been fortunate with the weather too.</p> <p>Clive Waddington said he had no success with East Riding of Yorkshire Council with the siting of the planters in North Bar Within, he has now written to a resident in North Bar Within to ask whether a planter can be placed between the steps and a response is awaited. Suggestions for siting of the plots were garden on Hengate and Jubilee Garden to replace the broken box.</p> <p>Clive Waddington reported the plants are being delivered on the 26th May and the barrier liners need to be re-wicked before then. Linda Freeman to contact Mr Dean as Chair of the Group to assist.</p> <p>Clive Waddington said the final report to the Tesco Bags of Help scheme for the release of the final £2000 cannot be done until the barrier is in place.</p> <p>David Ryley reported that the criteria and frequency of the Tesco Bags of Help scheme had changed.
