13. To receive and accept apologies for absence

No apologies were offered as all members were present.

14. (a) To record declarations of interest by any member of the council in respect of the agenda items listed below. Members declaring interests should identify the agenda item and type of interest being declared.

Cllr Dodsworth declared that had had knowledge of working with Volunteen at the Track and Fitness Boxing Club, this was noted as a non-pecuniary interest.

14. To consider the following Grant Applications:

Cllr Jack welcomed all applicants and explained the format of the evening.

(i) Joint Board Beverley Town Churches One Town Story Combined Project with St Mary's and Beverley Minster - £1500.00

Power: Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 S.19

To contribute 50% to develop website to promote and market the project and provide up to date information

Gail Cahill spoke on the above funding application and the need for a website to promote the Two Churches, One Town Story. Discussion took place and members recommended that partial funding for £1,250 be awarded to the project.

Recommended - That partial funding for £1,250 be awarded to the project.

(ii) East Riding Voluntary Action Services (ERVAS) Ltd - £3000.00 Power: S.137/ Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 S.19 To contribute to fund a Volunteering for Young People in East Riding Coordinator £2250, general project costs £250, contribution to premises £250 and general support £250

The representative spoke on the Volunteen project and explained the importance of funding to continue the good work that had already been made. Discussion took place on the costs involved with salary payments. Members discussed the application and recommended that the full funding of £3,000 be awarded to this project.

Recommended - That £3,000 be awarded to ERVAS to continue the Volunteen project.

Power: Local Government Act 1972 S. 145

To provide 16 pipe bag covers £640, instructors for 2 days £480, venue hire £180, travel £210 and dinner, bed and breakfast for instructors £280

Paul Wright spoke on the application submitted. Members discussed the different costs involved and made a recommendation to fund the cost of the 16 Beverley crested pipe bag covers at the cost of £640.

Recommended – That the sum of £640 be awarded to pay for the 16 Beverley crested pipe bag covers.

(iv) Mill Lane United - £1,000.00

Power: Open Spaces Act 1906 s.9/10

To contribute for travel and accommodation for a team of players to take part in a football training camp in Holland for 4 days (total cost £4112)

Representatives spoke on the Mill Lane training camp project. Members asked relevant questions and recommended to award the full grant of £1,000 to Mill Lane United for the community sport and youth activities.

Recommended – That the full grant of £1,000 be awarded to Mill Lane United.

(v) Beverley Male Voice Choir - £590.00

Power: Local Government Act 1972 S, 145

Contribution for hall rental £195, accompanist fees £50, hospitality £200 and siting of Banner £145 for a joint concert with Mansfield Male Voice Choir on Friday 2nd June for the benefit of Hornsea Inshore rescue (total cost £840)

Representatives spoke on the Beverley Male Voice fundraising event. Members asked relevant questions and recommended to award the partial grant of £590 to Beverley Male Voice Choir.

Recommended - That a full grant of £590 be awarded to Beverley Male Voice Choir.
